

DISCLAIMER: COVID-19 data are reported as timely, accurately, and completely as made available to us. Data are updated as we receive information that is more complete and may change over time as we learn more. The new case increase may not match the difference between today's and yesterday's total cases because of the daily removal of newly identified duplicates and out of state cases. Points on the map do not represent the actual location of cases or deaths. Cases reported include individuals with positive COVID-19 confirmatory test results reported on the residence of the patient. Patients may be hospitalized or seek care outside their Parish of residence. Case counts reported on the SCP Dashboard represent individual persons with positive results for COVID-19, not numbers of positive test results received. Multiple results are often reported for an individual (positive, or otherwise) due to repeat testing, but a single positive test for each individual is used for case counting. LDH uses an extensive de-duplication process involving automated and manual review to account for non-exact person matches due to data entry errors, incomplete data, and other issues in the lab data reported to LDH. Despite our best efforts, there may still be a small number of duplicate records in our dataset, and these will be resolved as they are detected, which may lead to changes in case counts. 










