Reasons for my objections:



Location of auto repair shop next to residences and a children's nursery.

Total lack of concern for other people's property evidenced by destruction of fences and debris.

Lack of concern for noise levels—day and night.

Fumes coming from the shop as well as open air fires that have resulted in noxious odors that have been occurring.



This photo shows a large piece of equipment which in the past was enclosed by a fence which I feel had been erected for the purpose of protecting the public. The fence was destroyed by the present owners.

On a daily basis, there are cars and trucks coming and going at all times of the day and night.


On several occasions I have been awakened from my sleep in the late evening by rumbling noise and revving of engines that has been coming from 15717 River Road property.

The music that blares from the repair shop area is also an annoyance.




Not only are tires beginning to appear, but in the forefront of the picture shows the remains of the scattered remains of the fence.

From the edge of my property, I see debris, palettes, and cars.


This natural barrier of plants dies during the winter and the view from my property is the appearance of a junk yard.



Dirt was added to the property, which are now hills for a four-wheeler track.




This swing is in direct path of the four-wheeler track. (Just saying)
