attached are the notes I sent you last week. Along with these notes I have attached. what I believe to be a proposition similar to the proposition Kenner used to modify their charter to accommodate the issue being discussed.

If I did not truly believe the terms limits issue was unfair to the people I wouldn't be discussing this with you.

Again, I have a problem with terms limits applying only to the council and parish president. It implies that this group is less trustworthy that other elected officials. if you disagree with me, please explain why. I'm not raising this issue to be confrontational, rather, it's a question that I have had for some time. If someone can explain why term limits are necessary for one group and not the others PLEAD DO.

How many of you (council members) are prohibited by term limits from running for the position you now hold?

I'm here hoping to open the terms limit rule, to discussion.

It is my understanding that the original parish charter did not include term limits (1970's)

In the 1990's the charter was changed to include term limits. When I asked for background information on how the term limit amendment came about I was informed that there was very little council discussion, no committee meetings, and no formal input from the public. The mood of the public at the time was pro term limits, it was proposed, put on the ballot and the voters approved the charter amendment.

I don't think we should eliminate terms limits as there are too many important reasons why we should keep it. However, I have a problem with the term limits in that it sometimes takes an effective official out of office at an inopportune time. Not to mention the fact that the Council & Parish President are the only elected officials in the parish with term limits.

What I would like you to do is propose to the voters an amendment to the charter that would allow a term limited official to petition the electorate of their district, in an attempt to get their name on the ballot for the next election, I assume it would take 1/3 of the registered voters to get back on the ballot.

Getting 1/3 of registered voters to sign the petition would take a lot of work.... you would be asking the voters for permission to run again.....

do you think a official who has not been effective or responsive to their constituents has a very good chance of getting back on the ballot?.

On the other had if an official is doing a great job or is involved in major project which should get uninterrupted attention, you might get the petition signed.

Regardless of who you are it would be quite a task to get1/3 of the registered voters to sign off on this.

I'm not sure what has to be done to amend the charter. I assume it will take a vote of the people. I ask that you put this out to the public at the earliest possible date as this seems to be fair to the voters and the elected officials. Let the people decide.

I am of the impression that we would not be the first political body to provide for this process. I understand Kenner has it in their charter and it has been used.
