# BY SENATORS MORRELL, BUFFINGTON AND PEACOCK

1	AN ACT
2	To enact R.S. 40:4.15, relative to public water systems; to provide with respect to certain
3	disinfectant levels; to provide for exemptions; to provide for an annual report; and
4	to provide for related matters.
5	Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:
6	Section 1. R.S. 40:4.15 is hereby enacted to read as follows:
7	§4.15. Minimum disinfectant residual level of free or total chlorine throughout
8	public water systems; rules and regulations; reporting
9	A. The Department of Health and Hospitals, office of public health, shall
0	promulgate rules and regulations pursuant to the Administrative Procedure Act
1	that require a public water system to maintain a minimum disinfectant level of
2	free or total chlorine in the water being delivered to the distribution system, in
3	finished water storage tanks, and in all points of the distribution. Such rules
4	and regulations shall not specify a minimum disinfectant level of less than 0.1
15	parts per million. This Section shall apply to any water system that provides
6	water for residential consumption and use. However, the provisions of this
17	Section shall not apply to any private water system that supplies water to three
8	or less residences or that is used primarily for agricultural operations as defined
19	<u>in R.S. 3:3602(5).</u>
20	B. The department shall review such rules and regulations as necessary
21	and shall submit an annual report as to the state of public water systems across
22	Louisiana to the Senate Committee on Health and Welfare and the House
23	Committee on Health and Welfare no later than February first of each year.
24	C. An industrial user that owns, operates, and maintains a water system
25	dedicated to the exclusive use of its operations or facilities may apply for a
26	variance from any requirement to maintain a minimum disinfectant level of free

1 or total chlorine in its water system. The department shall review any such 2 variance request and may grant approval if not inconsistent with applicable 3 federal statute, rule, or regulation. Nothing in this Section shall be construed 4 to require such an industrial user or consumer holding such a variance or 5 holding a variance pending final agency determination to reapply for such 6 variance.
