
30 Yard Recycle Slot Roll Off Containers

A major processor of household recyclables in the New Orleans area is getting out of the business, effective May 17, 2019. That will increase haulers' costs when they start diverting their trucks 90 miles away to the company's plant north of Baton Rouge.

Republic Services Inc.'s sorting plant at 804 L&A Road in Metairie might be the only local one still accepting the plastics, paper and metal cans, said the Phoenix-based company Friday may 3, 2019. But will stop receiving household discards in two weeks, contract by contract.

#### **Hauling to Baton Rouge Pricing:**

- Pelican Waste our current provider, their price quote from Republic Services \$714 per load
- Republic Services price quote to parish directly \$624 per load and \$222 per ton sorting fee totaling \$846 per haul

2018 Annual Budget = \$36, 000 2019 Current Budget cost due to price increases \$46,700

Unfortunate recommendation to temporary suspend all recycling operation/drop sites in St. Charles Parish.
