


What's New in 2025

St. Charles Little League



The Department of St. Charles Parish Parks and Recreation is proud to announce that department is now a part of the Little League Official Community and the holder of the new St. Charles Little League charter, bringing an exciting new opportunity for young athletes across St. Charles and St. John Parish.

The newly established Little League program is open to boys and girls ages nine through twelve and will serve eligible athletes who live or attend school in St. Charles or St. John the Baptist Parish.





Youth Sports Registration Cost Reduction Initiative:

For many years, the St. Charles Parish Department of Parks and Recreation has remained committed to reducing the financial burden of youth recreational sports participation for parish families. By transitioning registration oversight from independent Booster Clubs to centralized departmental management, the Department streamlined administrative processes, provided a cost reductive solution, improved financial transparency, and enhanced operational efficiency of collection. For many years, the booster club volunteer structure has worked tirelessly to provide the youth of St. Charles Parish the opportunity to participate in the sport of their choosing, by way of registering participants and providing the means and avenues for accessibility to registration.

Through strategic partnerships with nationally recognized organizations such as the New Orleans Pelicans, NFL Flag, and Jr. NBA, the Department has secured program support, marketing assistance, and resource efficiencies that further offset participation costs.

As a direct result of these combined efforts, youth sports registration fees have been reduced from \$65.00 per participant to \$45.00, and in select programs as low as \$35.00. These reductions represent a significant savings for St. Charles Parish families and reinforce the Department's commitment to accessibility, affordability, and equitable recreational opportunities.

2025 Example Flag Football -580 participants @ \$65.00 = \$37,000, reduced to \$45.00 = \$26,100, Savings of \$10,900

2025 Example Basketball- 902 participants @ \$65.00 = \$58,630 reduced to \$35.00 = \$31,570. Savings of \$27,060

2026 Example Baseball / Softball- 1161 participants @ \$65.00 = \$75,465 reduced to \$35.00 = \$40,635. Savings of \$34,830

Total Cost Savings of \$72,790 for the 3 major sports offered.




