Personally came and appeared:

AUDUBON BARGES, INC., a corporation duly organized under the laws of the State of Louisiana, which corporation is domiciled in Boutte, Louisiana, herein appearing through Robin B. Durant, its representative duly authorized by resolution of the Board of Directors of said corporation, adopted by said Board of Directors, a certified copy of which is annexed;

and

THE PARISH OF ST. CHARLES, a political subdivision of the State of Louisiana, herein appearing through Albert D. Laque, President of the Parish of St. Charles, duly authorized by the provisions of Ordinance No. 00-6-8 as adopted by the Parish Council as the governing authority of the Parish of St. Charles

which declared that they do by these presents, make an exchange of property on the express terms and conditions hereinafter set forth, as follows, to-wit:

For and in consideration of the transfer to it as hereinafter set forth, AUDUBON BARGES, INC. does hereby grant, bargain, assign, set over, transfer and deliver unto the PARISH OF ST. CHARLES the following described property, situated in the Parish of St. Charles, Louisiana, to-wit:

A certain piece or portion of ground situated in the State of Louisiana, Parish of St. Charles, Section 68, Township 13 South, Range 20 East, designated as 153,283.77 square foot portion of Durant Property and more fully described as follows:

Commencing at the intersection of the centerline of Texas & Pacific Railroad Right of Way Line and the line common to Section 10 and Section 68, Township 13 South, Range 20 East, measure thence N17°45′00″E a distance of 422.13 feet to a point, the point of beginning. Measure thence N17°45′00″E a distance of 589.94 feet to a point, measure thence N64°45′00″E a distance of

147.42 feet to a point, measure thence S21°15′00″E a distance of 468.75 feet to a point, measure thence S68°45′00″W a distance of 518.32 feet to a point, the point of beginning.

Said portion of ground contains 153,283.77 square feet, 3.519 acres.

All as more fully shown on a plan of survey by BFM Corporation dated June 18, 2000 and revised June 19, 2000.

And, now for and in consideration of the transfer to it as hereinafter set forth,
THE PARISH OF ST. CHARLES does hereby grant, bargain, assign, set over, transfer
and deliver, with all legal warranties and with full substitution and subrogation in and to
all the rights and actions of warranty which it has or may have against all preceding
owners and vendors, unto AUDUBON BARGES, INC. the following described property,
situated in the Parish of St. Charles, Louisiana to-wit:

A certain piece or portion of ground situated in the State of Louisiana, Parish of St. Charles, Section 24, Towship 13 South, Range 20 East, designated as 70,334.60 sq. ft., portion of St. Charles Parish Property and more fully described as follows:

Commencing at the intersection of the centerline of Texas & Pacific Railroad Right of Way Line and the line common to Section 10 and Section 68, Township 13 South, Range 20 East, measure thence N17°45′00″E a distance of 422.13 feet to a point, measure thence N68°45′00″E a distance of 1,597.50 feet to a point, the point of beginning. Measure thence N24°11′57 a distance of 50.07 feet to a point, measure thence N68°45′00″E a distance of 1,407.98 feet to a point, measure thence S21°15′00″E a distance of 50.00 feet to a point, measure thence S68°45′00″W a distance of 1,405.40 feet to a point, the point of beginning.

Said portion of ground contains 70,334.60 sq. ft.

All as more fully shown on plan of survey by BFM Corporation dated June 18, 2000 and revised June 19, 2000.

Said property is sold subject to any servitudes currently existing on said property, be they apparent or non-apparent.

This exchange is made and mutually delivered and accepted by the parties hereto. It is further agreed and understood that the properties exchanged are equal in value.

TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the above described properties unto said parties,

respectively, the one exchanger unto the other, their heirs, successors and assigns forever.

All state and city taxes for the years preceding passage of this act of exchange up to and including the taxes due and exigible in 1999 are paid, and the parties agree that each will pay the taxes for the current year on their respective properties acquired in this act of exchange.

The parties hereto waive any conveyance, mortgage and any other certificates and relieve and release me, notary, from any and all responsibility in connection therewith.

## RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS

OF

## AUDUBON BARGES, INC.

The following resolution was unanimously adopted by the Board of Directors of Audubon Barges, Inc. (hereinafter "the Corporation") at a special meeting held on the 28th day of June, 2000.

WHEREAS the Corporation filed a lawsuit against St. Charles Parish challenging its attempt to expropriate some of the Corporation's property for an expansion of the Halmville sewer plant.

WHEREAS the Corporation and the Parish reached a settlement of that lawsuit.

WHEREAS the general terms of that settlement include the payment of \$75,000.00 to the Corporation by the Parish, the transfer of a servitude on the Corporation's property to the Parish for force main and effluent discharge sewer lines, the transfer of approximately 3.5 acres (more or less) of wetland property behind the existing sewer plant from the Corporation to the Parish, and the transfer of naked ownership of a road running through the Corporation's property from the Parish to the Corporation.

BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of Directors unanimously approved the settlement and authorized the Corporation's President, Robin B. Durant, to act as the Corporation's duly authorized agent and to sign all documents necessary to complete the settlement, including execution of the Act of Transfer of Servitude, the Act of Exchange of Property and the Release Agreement.
