Commissioner Dunn: I'd like to bring up something under new business. I'd like to bring up about proposing to moving the meetings from 7 o'clock to 6 o'clock and open it up for discussion. I think it would better serve the public, it would be more convenient for them, especially when we have the long meetings that last late at night. It would also help the board members I believe, I don't think anybody would have an objection, I hope not, to it and I'd just like to see if we can move the meeting up to 6.

Commissioner Frangella: So would that change the, would we go pass 10 like the Council or would we have to, as of now, is it scheduled for 3 (hours) or as long as it takes?

Mr. Albert: It's your prerogative, it's your rules to set.

Commissioner Frangella: I was just asking as of right is it set?

Ms. Stein: I think there is something in the rules, I'm sorry I don't have them in front of me and I'd be lying if I said I knew for sure.

Mr. Albert: We need to check on the process on how to change the time and make sure it's simply in your rules. I know the code or the charter says which day of the month, but I'm not sure the time is set, we'll double check that and we'll talk to the Council Secretary on your behalf.

Commissioner Frangella: I just don't want it to run where we're here from 6-11. Seven to eleven was long enough.

Mr. Albert: If there is a recommendation of what you want it to be we'll take that as a basis for it so 6-10, basically following Council's example?

Commissioner Dunn: Exactly.
