

Interested parties are hereby notified that the Coastal Management Division of the Department of Natural Resources has received the following application for a Coastal Use Permit in accordance with the State and Local Coastal Resources Management Act of 1978, as amended, (Louislana R.S. 49, Sections 214.21-214.41), and the rules and regulations of the Coastal Resources Program.

NAME: Bridgeline Gas Distribution LLC

LOCATION: St. Charles Parish, LA; T12S-R20E and T13S-R20E. The two 6" & two 10" pipelines will begin at the Orion Refinery on the east bank of the Mississippi River at Lat. 29° 59' 20", Long. 90° 23' 56". The two 10" pipelines will terminate on the west bank of the Mississippi River at Lat. 29° 59' 02", Long. 90° 24' 37". One 6" pipeline will end at Lat. 29° 58' 23", Long. 90° 25' 42" and one 6" pipeline will end at Lat. 29° 58' 41". Long. 90° 27' 08".

DESCRIPTION: Proposed installation of approximately 4,200' of two 10" pipelines, approximately 11,100' of one 6", approximately 24,600' of one 6" pipeline, and a 100' x 50' valve site. Approximately 18,062 cu. yds. of native material will be temporarily displaced during pipeline installation. Approximately 4.8 acres of forested wetland may be permanently impacted by the proposed project and approximately 16.0 acres of forested wetland habitat may be temporarily impacted by the proposed project.**

^{*}The official date of the beginning of the public comment period for Coastal Use Permits and Water Quality Certification applications begins on the date of publication of the notice in the official state journal (The Advocate), in accordance with the Rules and Procedures for Coastal Use Permits, §723.C.5.c. The Coastal Management Division will inform interested parties of the exact date of publication on request.

^{**}Habitat impacts are based on available in-house data and may not represent actual conditions. Field reconnaissance may be required to verify extent of impacts.

THE APPLICANT MUST SECURE A STATE COASTAL USE PERMIT. LOUISIANA DEPARTMENT OF ENVIRONMENTAL QUALITY WATER QUALITY CERTIFICATION IS ALSO REQUIRED. INDEPENDENT EVALUATIONS AND DECISIONS WILL BE MADE BY THE COASTAL MANAGEMENT DIVISION AND THE DEPARTMENT OF ENVIRONMENTAL QUALITY.

Plans for the proposed work are now on file and may be inspected at the office of the Coastal Management Division, Department of Natural Resources, State Land and Natural Resources Building, 625 North 4th Street, Room 1011, Baton Rouge, Louisiana 504/342-7591. Written comments, including suggestions for modifications or objections to the proposed work and stating the reasons thereof, are being solicited from anyone having an interest in this permit request. Comments to the State of Louisiana, Coastal Management Division must be mailed within 25 days of the date of official journal publication of this notice to Coastal Management Division, Louisiana Department of Natural Resources, P.O. box 44487, Capitol Station, Baton Rouge, Louisiana 70804-4487. 
State of Louisiana Coastal Use Permit Criteria


The decision on whether or not to issue a Coastal Use Permit will be based on an evaluation of the probable impacts of the proposed activity in accordance with the state policies outlined in R.S. 49:214.22. The decision will reflect the national concern for both protection and utilization of important resources. The decision must be consistent with the state program and approved local programs for affected parishes and must represent an appropriate balancing of social, environmental and economic factors. All factors which may be relevant to the proposal will be considered; among these are flood and storm hazards, water quality, water supply, feasible alternative sites, drainage patterns, historical sites, economics, public and private benefits, coastal water dependency, impacts on natural features, compatibility with the natural and cultural setting and the extent of long term benefits or adverse impacts.


Public Hearings



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- ALL STRUCTURES, FACILITIES, WELL, AND PIPELINES/FLOWLINES OCCURRING IN OPEN WATER AREAS OR IN OIL FIELD CANALS OR SLIPS SHALL BE REMOVED WITHIN 120 DAYS OF ABANDONMENT OF THE FACILITIES FOR THE HEREIN PERMITTED USE UNLESS PRIOR WRITTEN APPROVAL TO LEAVE SUCH STRUCTURES IN PLACE IS RECEIVED FROM THE COASTAL MANAGEMENT DIVISION. THIS CONDITION DOES NOT PRECLUDE THE NECESSITY FOR REVISING THE CURRENT PERMIT OR OBTAINING A SEPARATE COASTAL USE PERMIT. SHOULD ONE BE REQUIRED, FOR SUCH REMOVAL ACTIVITIES.
- 2. AS-BUILT DRAWINGS SHALL BE SUBMITTED WITHIN 30 DAYS OF COMPLETION OF THIS PROJECT TO THE LOUISIANA DEPARTMENT OF NATURAL RESOURCES, OFFICE OF CONSERVATION, PIPELINE DIVISION, P.O. BOX 74275, BATON ROUGE, LA. 70804 AND TO THE LOUISIANA DEPARTMENT OF NATURAL RESOURCES, COASTAL MANAGEMENT DIVISION, P.O. BOX 44487, BATON ROUGE, LA. 70804-4487.
- 3. STRUCTURES WILL BE MARKED/LIGHTED IN ACCORDANCE WITH U.S. COAST GUARD REGULATIONS.
- IN ORDER TO ENSURE THE SAFETY OF ALL PARTIES, THE PERMITTEE SHALL CONTACT THE LOUISIANA ONE-CALL SYSTEM (1-800-272-3020) A MINIMUM OF 48 HOURS PRIOR TO THE COMMENCEMENT OF ANY EXCAVATION (DIGGING, DREDGING, JETTING, ETC.) OR DEMOLITION ACTIVITY.
- 5. APPROXIMATELY 18,082 CU. YDS OF CLAYS & SILTS WILL BE EXCAVATED BY MARSH BUGGY, BACK HOE, OR DRAGLINE.
 SPOIL WILL BE PLACED ADJACENT TO PIPE DITCH DURING CONSTRUCTION FOLLOWING CONSTRUCTION AVAILABLE SPOIL WILL BE RETURNED TO PIPE DITCH
- 6. APPROXIMATELY 20.8 ACRES OF TREES ARE TO BE CLEARED FOR PERMANENT RIGHT OF WAY, TEMPORARY RIGHT OF WAY AND EXTRA WORK SPACES. TREES ARE TO BE CHIPPED.
