A resolution adopting the St. Charles Parish Residential Antidisplacement and Relocation Assistance Plan for usage in the implementation of the FY 2019 St. Charles Parish Louisiana Community Development Block Grant (LCDBG) Program Sewer Improvements project.

WHEREAS, the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development prohibits the release of Community Development Block Grant funds until the grantee officially adopts and certifies that it is following a Residential Antidisplacement and Relocation Assistance Plan; and,

WHEREAS, St. Charles Parish has formulated its Residential Antidisplacement and Relocation Assistance Plan under Section 104(d) of the Housing and Community Development Act of 1974, as amended.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, THAT WE, THE MEMBERS OF THE ST. CHARLES PARISH COUNCIL, do hereby adopt the St. Charles Parish Residential Antidisplacement and Relocation Assistance Plan attached hereto, as required under Section 104(d) of the Housing and Community Development Act of 1974, as amended, for usage in the implementation of the FY 2019 St. Charles Parish Louisiana Community Development Block Grant (LCDBG) Program Sewer Improvements project.

FY2019 LCDBG PROGRAM/SEWER SYSTEM IMPROVEMENTS**

**RESIDENTIAL ANTIDISPLACEMENT AND RELOCATION
ASSISTANCE PLAN UNDER SECTION 104(d) OF THE
HOUSING AND COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT ACT OF 1974, AS AMENDED**

St. Charles Parish will replace all occupied and vacant occupiable low/moderate-income dwelling units demolished or converted to a use other than as low/moderate-income housing as a direct result of activities assisted with funds provided under the Housing and Community Development Act of 1974, as amended, as described in 24 CFR 570.606(b)(1). The St. Charles Parish Antidisplacement contact person is Ms. Stephanie Brüning, Grants Officer, who can be reached at (985)783-5000.

All replacement housing will be provided within three years of the commencement of the demolition or rehabilitation relating to conversion. Before obligating or expending funds that will directly result in such demolition or conversion, the Parish will notify the public and submit to the Division of Administration the following information in writing:

1. A description of the proposed assisted activity;
2. The general location on a map and approximate number of dwelling units by size (number of bedrooms) that will be demolished or converted to a use other than low/moderate-income dwelling units as a direct result of the assisted activity;
3. A time schedule for the commencement and completion of the demolition or conversion;
4. The general location on a map and approximate number of dwelling units by size (number of bedrooms) that will be provided as replacement dwelling units;
5. The source of funding and a time schedule for the provision of replacement dwelling units; and
6. The basis for concluding that each replacement dwelling unit will remain in a low/moderate-income unit for at least ten (10) years from the date of initial occupancy.

St. Charles Parish will provide relocation assistance, as described in 570.606(b)(2), to each low/moderate-income household displaced by the demolition of housing or by the conversion of a low/moderate-income dwelling to another use as a direct result of assisted activities.

Consistent with the goals and objectives of activities assisted under the Act, the Parish will take the following steps to minimize the displacement of persons from their homes:

1. All public facilities projects (water, sewer, gas, etc.) will be designed so that there will be no displacement of any residences or businesses;
2. No homes will be demolished that can be rehabilitated; and
3. There will be no displacement of any residential or business occupants on LCDBG projects.
