




2022 Accomplishments

Construction Permitting

In 2022, the Department issued:

- 1,545 Total Permits
 - 142 New Homes
 - 543 Renovations
 - 22 New Commercial
 - 61 Home Occupation Permits
- The yearly volume of permitting activity was still impacted by the aftermath of Hurricane Ida.

For the past 6 years, St. Charles Parish has chaired the Building Code Construction Council.




Major Subdivision Activity



Comprehensive Plan Update Adoption




Coastal Zone

- St. Charles's Local Coastal Program went into effect late in 2017. In 2022 the Local Program processed 9 permits locally. This is keeping decisions local rather than out of Baton Rouge.
- Permits have included everything from a single-family home to expansions of local industry.
- The contract with the State of Louisiana was renewed for State Fiscal Years 2023 through 2025.
- Marny Stein has made the move from our Planning Section to Coastal Zone Management Administrator.



Coastal Zone

- The St. Charles's Parish Christmas Tree Program place aver 3000 live Christmas tree into existing cribs in the Simonaux Ponds area of Bayou Gauche. The project continues to build land and keep that material out of landfills.
- The much anticipated Marsh Creation Project PO-75, which will create 1200 acres of marsh in the LaBranche Wetlands has been bid and awarded by the state. The project is slated to start construction in summer 2023 and will run for approximately 500 days (until around fall of 2024).
