Desr St. Charles Parish Council Members,

The River Region Chamber of Commerce wishes to express its serious concern regarding Council Resolution 2004-0370, that was adopted in September of 2004, and requests that the Council take immediate action to resent this resolution.

While challenging tax exemptions may sound like a worthy cause, we believe it is a "quick fix" solution that could result in a long-term economic disaster for the paxish and its citizens. Industrial Tax Exemptions are at the heart of the State's Economic Development program and have assisted in creating billions of dollars in industrial investments over the years and ten's of thousands of permanent jobs. In St. Charles Parish alone, these investments total over a billion dollars and created several thousand permanent jobs.

Your resolution suggests that St. Charles Parish flavors mitigating this program and adding additional layers of bureaucracy thirty mild make the program dumbers one at best and impossible to execute at worst. This message will have a very negative impost on the efforts of the State and Parish to attract new industry or copyince existing industry to expand their facilities.

The State of Louisiana is in competition with other states in attracting new businesses to our area. Tampering with these exemptions could put Louisiana in a competitive disadvantage. Businesses considering a location in Louisiana may get the impression that St. Charles Parish is only interested in them for the taxes they will pay.
