A resolution to add St. Charles Parish to a letter of support for the New Orleans East Landbridge project to be considered for funding by the Louisiana Trustee Implementation Group. WHEREAS, the Deepwater Horizon Oil Spill impacted nearshore coastal marsh habitat throughout Louisiana, including the New Orleans East Landbridge; and, WHEREAS, in addition to impacts from the oil spill, canal dredging, levees, wave exposure, subsidence and sea level rise have caused erosion and recession of the shoreline, leading to significant degradation of vital marsh habitat; and, WHEREAS, the landbridge separates the Gulf of Mexico and Lake Borgne from Lake Pontchartrain and, without action, is on track to largely disappear over the next 50 years; and, WHEREAS, the landbridge provides vital wetland and estuarine functions, including control of tidal flow between the Gulf of Mexico and Lake Pontchartrain, benefitting the ecosystem and the people who rely on a healthy estuary for their livelihoods; and, the landbridge also serves as important habitat for hundreds of species of fish and WHEREAS. wildlife, including sturgeon and migratory birds; and, WHEREAS, the landbridge reduces storm surge and provides storm protection for over one million people who live around Lake Pontchartrain and Lake Maurepas, including communities in St. Charles Parish; and, WHEREAS, the City of New Orleans and the Louisiana Coastal Protection and Restoration Authority (CPRA) have a large-scale restoration project on the landbridge in early planning stages, but major funding is needed to implement the project; and, WHEREAS. the project would create 1,500 acres of brackish marsh habitat and over 4 miles of living shoreline protection in Lake Borgne along the eastern perimeter of the marsh creation area; and, WHEREAS, project proposals are currently being accepted through the Deepwater Horizon Natural Resource Damage Assessment (NRDA) process; and, WHEREAS, this is a potential opportunity to fund the large-scale project on the landbridge. NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, THAT WE, THE MEMBERS OF THE ST. CHARLES PARISH COUNCIL, do hereby add St. Charles Parish to a letter of support that will be submitted for consideration with the City of New Orleans' New Orleans East Landbridge project proposal to the Louisiana Trustee Implementation Group before the March 2, 2021 deadline.

Re: New Orleans East Landbridge Restoration Increment 1 Letter of Support

Dear Trustees-

On behalf of our 136 signers representing local governments, legislators, community-based non-profits, sportsmen, restaurateurs, faith leaders, conservation organizations, scientists, business leaders, and concerned citizens, we write to express enthusiastic support for restoration of "New Orleans East Landbridge Restoration Increment 1" and urge selection of this large-scale project in the Louisiana Trustee Implementation Group's Restoration Plan #8.

The Deepwater Horizon Oil Spill impacted nearshore coastal marsh habitat throughout Louisiana, including the New Orleans East Landbridge. This landbridge separates Lake Pontchartrain from Lake Borgne and the Gulf of Mexico and is considered a critical landscape feature by the Army Corps of Engineers. Unfortunately, in addition to impacts from the oil spill, canal dredging, levees, wave exposure, subsidence and sea level rise have caused erosion and recession of the shoreline, leading to significant degradation of vital marsh habitat. Without action, the landbridge is on track to largely disappear over the next fifty years. Losing this feature will have a major impact on people and wildlife in the Greater New Orleans area. Large-scale restoration is urgently needed to restore eroding and degraded marsh, improving and increasing protection from flooding.

The landbridge serves several important functions, making restoration imperative:

- Reduces storm surges and provides storm protection for over 1.5 million people who live around Lake Pontchartrain and Lake Maurepas, including the cities of New Orleans, Baton Rouge, Metairie, LaPlace, Mandeville and Slidell;
- Provides vital wetland and estuarine functions, including control of tidal flow between the Gulf of Mexico and Lake Pontchartrain, benefitting the ecosystem and the people who rely on a healthy estuary for their livelihoods;
- Serves as important habitat for hundreds of species of fish and wildlife, including sturgeon and migratory birds;
- Aids the effectiveness of the Hurricane & Storm Damage Risk Reduction System (HSDRRS) surrounding the Greater New Orleans and hosts the Highway 90 hurricane evacuation route.

Restoration of the New Orleans Landbridge has garnered support from tens of thousands of people since Hurricane Katrina. The City of New Orleans and the Louisiana Coastal Protection and Restoration Authority, with robust support from state and local leaders, NGOs, and community groups, have begun preliminary design work on a large-scale restoration project on the landbridge with National Fish and Wildlife Foundation funding. The proposed project would create 1500 acres of brackish marsh habitat and over 4 miles of living shoreline protection in Lake Borgne along the eastern perimeter of the marsh creation area. The project is located near

the Rigolets in an area recommended by the 2012 Army Corps MRGO Ecosystem Feasibility Report and the 2017 Louisiana Coastal Master Plan. It is also a priority area identified in the City of New Orleans Resilience Strategy and the Orleans Parish Hazard Mitigation Plan.

As concerned stakeholders, we urge selection of this large-scale marsh creation and living shoreline project to advance to full implementation through the NRDA process. Thank you for your consideration.
